A Season of Light

That is exactly what Epiphany is all about!

The dictionary defines Epiphany in this way:

1. an appearance or manifestation, esp. of a deity.
2. a Christian festival, observed on Jan. 6, commemorating the manifestation of Christ to the gentiles in the persons of the Magi; Twelfth Day.
3. a sudden, intuitive perception of or insight into reality or the essential meaning of something, often initiated by some simple, commonplace occurrence.

But why is it about light? Well, the season of Epiphany focuses on the light of Christ in the darkened world.

What a wonderful time of year to focus on the light of God, especially in this part of the country when we don't see a whole lot of light. Winter brings us much darkness! Many people suffer from light deprivation syndrome.

From the world's standpoint, it is the bleakest time, but we know of the hope in Christ that we are privileged to have. We know that this darkness will soon end and it will become more and more light. Those of us who worship Christ know for a fact that the darkness will not overcome our lives!

In Isaiah 60 we hear: "Arise, shine; for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you. For darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness the peoples; but the Lord will arise upon you, and his glory will appear over you." (Isa. 60:1-2)

Take time during this season to focus on God's light in your life. Ask yourself, "What am I doing to promote God's light in the world?"

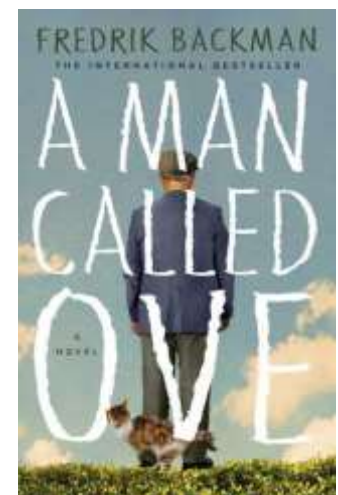
